

The Players: Donor Organizations



- Many of these organizations are supported by a broad base of individual donors, from small online donations to significant investments

 - Committee on States
 - The Tides Foundation



In the beginning there were coordinated campaigns



- Before 2002, the Democratic Party convened "coordinated campaign tables"
 - Candidates and staff
 - Party committees (DNC; DCCC; DSCC)
- Coordinated campaigns worked together to avoid duplication of effort

The Independent Coordinating Entity: America Votes



- A coalition of over 40 groups, working together to coordinate their independent electoral activity
- State-based coalition, with tables in 14 states
- Create a permanent progressive infrastructure
- Share innovative strategies and resources, create plans
- Maximize electoral impact
- And build lasting capacity by providing access to services like VAN, Catalist, ISSI, and more

The Data Entity: Catalist



- A national database of all voting age individuals in the United States
- A robust and enhanced file, with models, specialty data, and comprehensive vote history
- A transparent file, with clear descriptions of the data
- A data warehouse that holds voter contact records and results

Using the Data: ISSI



ISSI is a not-for-profit corporation that provides data management, targeting and coalition-building advice and services to America Votes, State Voices and Unity

Helps maximize the tools offered by Catalist and make the most of their voter contact and advocacy campaigns

Polling and Testing and Research



- The Polling Consortium: Serves as a central repository for progressive polling data, allowing analysts to examine trends on a much more granular level
- The Analyst Institute: Sharing results of experiments and modeling to develop "best practices" for voter contact
- Project New West: An LLC that conducts and shares research and strategy in 8 western states with its subscribers

The Planning Entity: The Atlas Project



- The Atlas Project collects and maintains documents from previous campaigns, and develops strategic roadmaps for key states
- AP has developed a searchable database of over 100,000 campaign documents from 2000 to present day, including
 - Campaign plans, targeting memos, voter contact materials, and media buy & polling data
- AP is currently producing
 - Roadmaps and targeting reports for 26 states in 2010
 - Redistricting reports in key states
 - State-by-state summaries of finance rules and voter files



State Voices



State Voices was established in 2007 to coordinate the 501 (c)(3) activity in 16 states

Their mission:

- Create the conditions for candidates and elections to focus on the issues that matter to the partners
- Foster non-traditional partnerships that cut across issue silos
- Facilitate planning and coordination of work
- Provide the hardware, software, and support necessary to conduct state of the art advocacy, translating electoral tools to year-round policy work

Unity



- A coalition of nearly 30 organizations working to engage the public, through education and advocacy, to achieve a broad progressive policy agenda
- Develop a shared strategy with a common list of policy targets and objectives across major issue campaigns
- Expand and strengthen participating organizations' ability to respond rapidly to key organizing moments
- Plan for a permanent progressive infrastructure

Specific Issue Coordination



HCAN – Health Care for America Now

 A coalition of over 500 groups working for quality, affordable health care for everyone.

American Rights at Work

 A coalition of unions and progressive organizations working to pass EFCA, to restore workers' freedom to choose whether to join a union

Clean Energy Works

A non-partisan effort to move the US to clean energy sources

Reform Immigration for America

 A national effort that brings together individuals and grassroots organizations with the mission to build support for workable comprehensive immigration reform.

Americans for Financial Reform

 A coalition of nearly 200 national, state and local consumer, labor, retiree, investor, community, and civil rights organizations working together to spearhead a campaign for real reform in our banking and financial system

Specific Issue Coordination



Redistricting

- Foundation for the Future and National Democratic Redistricting Trust: organizing the legislative and legal strategy for fair redistricting.
- National Committee for an Effective Congress (NCEC): providing the targeting data and mapping strategy for fair redistricting
- DLCC: developing and executing an electoral strategy to protect or pick up key legislative bodies.

 An independent, non-profit organization that uses quantitative and qualitative data to shape the public debate and issue agenda




